FALL FINALS FEES

ENTRIES, ENTRY DEADLINES, FEES:

Show entries must be postmarked by September 15, 2023 to avoid a late fee. Late Entry Fee is applied to entries postmarked after the deadline or received in show office.

CLASS ENTRY FEES:

\$25 per class, with the following exceptions:

\$10 for Lead Line

\$15 per Ground Rail & Beginner Rider Classes

\$35 per Classic/Derby

\$35 per Medal Final, Equitation Finals

\$5 competitor number fee, returned if number is returned to show secretary.

- All entry blanks must be filled out completely and legibly with one horse per entry form.
- An open check must accompany every entry.
- Entry forms must be signed by the owner or agent, trainer, and if the exhibitor is a minor by a parent or guardian.
- No numbers will be given out without the entry paid in full or an open check left with the secretary.

Please review the USEF/USHJA rules regarding horse recording and awards for additional fees which may apply.

STABLING AND STABLING FEES

Stall fee is \$75/day (day-time use only) or \$130 for the weekend.

Horses stabled overnight will be charged the weekend stall rate. Semi-Permanent 10' x 10' box stalls with doors will be available. The stalls will be available Thursday afternoon after 1:00 pm. No sharing of stalls is permitted. Bedding will be available for purchase at the horse show. **FIRST BEDDING IS NOT PROVIDED.** No straw bedding permitted. Stalls will not be held without payment. Shavings are \$8.00/bag.

ADDITIONAL FEES

- Jump out/trailer in fee: \$75/day for each non-stalled horse or pony
- Non-showing fee: \$50 per stalled horse or pony not entered in a class
- Medic Fee: \$15 per entry
- Office Fee: \$40 per entry
- Late Entry Fee: \$30 per entry. (Entries postmarked after deadline or submitted in the show office.) There is no late entry fee for horses entered by the closing date and adding additional classes the day of the horse show.
- Refund Processing fee: \$30 per entry
- Insufficient Funds/Returned Check fee: \$50 per check

RULES & REGULATIONS

ADD/SCRATCH CLASSES

Absolutely NO ADDS will be accepted at the gate without an add slip being filled at the office and a copy of the add slip given to the ring master. No exceptions. Riders may scratch classes at any time PRIOR TO THE START OF THE CLASS. No scratches will be accepted once the class has begun.

NUMBERS

A number will be assigned to each horse entry and must be visible on the rider when in the ring. Each horse must be exhibited under his or her own number.

SCHOOLING

ALL RINGS: Close one hour before start time to prepare the ring. GROUND RAILS/BEGINNER RIDER SCHOOLING: Will run 30 minutes prior to start of the division. Riders must be supervised while schooling.

JUMP ORDER AND COURSES

Trainers MUST pre-post at the in-gate. The posting order will be strictly adhered to, and when called riders will be expected to report to the gate as the proceeding rider begins. If there is a class conflict, the Show Committee will decide which ring has precedence. Over fences classes will have precedence over under saddle classes. Jumps and courses in all classes are subject to change at the discretion of the Show Committee. Courses will be posted at the in gate. A dotted line may be used for courtesy circles.

RIBBONS

Eight ribbons will be awarded in each class. Medal classes will be awarded medals. Champion and Reserve will be awarded in all divisions.

HELMET RULE

NO RIDER (junior or adult, amateur or professional) may ride ANYWHERE on the show grounds without wearing protective headgear in accordance with the USEF helmet rule. Any rider in violation of this rule will be immediately prohibited from further riding until proper headgear, including chinstrap, is in place.

USEF / USHJA MEMBERSHIP

USEF membership is not required for Riders and Owners competing at Local Member shows. USHJA membership is not required for Riders and Owners competing at Local Member shows, unless the rider wishes to participate in the USHJA programs.

RULES & REGULATIONS

REFUNDS

Class fees will not be refunded without a vet certificate. To request a refund you must notify the Horse Show Office PRIOR to the start of the class. A vet certificate must accompany this form. Scratched classes, no shows, and stall fees are non-refundable under any circumstance. Class fees minus a \$50 processing fee will be mailed after the horse show. No refund requests will be honored after the completion of the show.

HEALTH CERTIFICATION

Per USEF rule GR 845 all horses and ponies must have a copy of a negative coggins test (within past 12 months) and documentation of Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes (Rhino) vaccinations (within 6 months) administration.

CANCELLATIONS/COMBINATIONS

The Show Committee reserves the right to cancel any classes where the number of entries is insufficient (in which case the entry fee will be refunded) and to combine classes or move classes from one ring to another at their discretion. The Show Committee also reserves the right to cancel the horse show at their discretion (in which case all fees will be refunded). The show office will be open Thursday from 1pm-6pm. Friday, Saturday, and Sunday from 7am to the end of the horse show.

COURSES AND GROUNDS

All inquiries, concerns, or requests related to courses, footing, barn, or grounds conditions should be directed to the Show Manager.

SHARPS CONTAINERS

Sharps containers will be available in every barn and should be used for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

RULES & REGULATIONS

USEF RULES REGARDING MINORS OPERATING MOTORIZED VEHICLES:

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions.

Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation.

Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. (If your competition bans motorized vehicles, please contact our office for further instruction.)

Dogs are not permitted to be loose on the show grounds and must be kept on leash and restrained by a handler or tied at all times.

NO LOOSE DOGS WILL BE TOLERATED!

WHJA POLICIES

ATTENTION TRAINERS:

- Under saddle classes in divisions with fence heights 2'6" and above will not be delayed due to trainer conflicts.
- A completed Add/Scratch Form, available in the show office, will be required to change a competitor's class entries. Please keep this in mind as you plan your entries.

CLASS SPLIT:

Beginner Rider classes will be split if there are 12 or more entries. All other Hunter and Equitation classes will be split if there are 16 or more entries.

CLASS COMBINATION:

Any division with less than three (3) competitors will be combined with appropriate fence height division. This policy applies to horse shows and year end awards. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

JUMP ORDER AND COURSES:

Trainers MUST pre-post at the in-gate. The posting order will be strictly adhered to, and when called riders will be expected to report to the gate as the proceeding rider begins. If there is a class conflict, the Show Committee will decide which ring has precedence. Over fences classes will have precedence over under saddle classes. Under Saddle and Flat classes for divisions with jump heights at 2'6" or higher will not be held up for trainer conflicts. It is the rider's responsibility to be at the ring when the class is opened. Management and staff will not be responsible for missed flat classes. Jumps and courses in all classes are subject to change at the discretion of the Show Committee. Courses will be posted at the in gate. A dotted line may be used for courtesy circles.

USEF / USHJA MEMBERSHIP:

USEF membership is not required for Riders and Owners competing at Local Member shows. USHJA membership is not required for Riders and Owners competing at Local Member shows unless the rider wishes to participate in the USHJA programs. Riders who join the USHJA with an Outreach Membership (free) or above earn points toward year-end rewards by participating in the designated USHJA Outreach classes. Horses wishing to earn points toward USHJA Outreach awards must be registered with USHJA on or before the first day of competition. Trainers of riders participating in the USHJA Outreach Program wishing to be recognized for year-end awards and recognition must be a USHJA Outreach member or higher on or before the first day of competition.

HUNTER DIVISIONS

All classes to be judged on performance and soundness, unless otherwise noted, with an emphasis on manners. Extreme speed to be penalized. Fences shall simulate obstacles found in the hunt field, including gates, brush, post and rail, coops, boxes, and walls.

Hunter under saddle is to be shown at a walk, trot and canter in both directions of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be obedient, alert, responsive, and move freely. Horses will not be eliminated for slight errors. Horses may be asked to hand gallop at the discretion of the judge. No more than eight horses will be asked to hand gallop at one time, and horses are not to gallop in green hunter divisions. Martingales are prohibited in under saddle classes.

WARM UP CLASSES

Ribbons (1st through 8th) and a first place prize will be awarded.

BABY GREEN HUNTER

Open to all horses or ponies that have not shown over fences at a USEF recognized show prior to October 16th of the current show season. Baby Green Hunters may not enter any classes exceeding 2'3" or they shall lose their eligibility for the remainder of the year. A horse or pony may compete in this division for one year only. Fence heights 2' – 2'3". No bending lines and no in-and-outs.

Open to a horse of any age unrestricted by previous showing in any division. Fence heights for Low Performance Hunter to be set at 3' to 3'3". Fence heights for High Performance Hunters to be set at 3'3" to 3'6". May be combined with Green Working Hunters at the respective fence heights if insufficient entries to fill the class.

USHJA OUTREACH PROGRAM

The USHJA Outreach Program has been established to engage and connect Hunter and Jumper riders, trainers and horse owners with the USHJA by providing the opportunity to participate in USHJA branded classes and competitions, to earn points toward year-end rewards and awards, and to earn the chance to participate in the prestigious USHJA National Championships.

USHJA Outreach Competitions and Classes provide the opportunity to earn national recognition in classes from walk/trot to 3'0" in Hunter and Equitation sections and .60m-1.20m in Jumper sections at rated and local shows.

Any rider may compete in Outreach Hunter, Jumper and Equitation classes, but riders wishing to earn points and national recognition must be USHJA **free** Outreach member or higher.

Competitors with a USHJA free Outreach membership or higher will be eligible to earn year-end awards and rewards in Hunters, Jumpers and Equitation. Rewards for competing in any USHJA Outreach Class (Hunter, Equitation, Jumper) will be based on total points earned. Riders achieving a Bronze, Silver or Gold point level will be eligible to redeem their points at year-end for items of their choice: USHJA logo wear; Bronze, Silver, or Gold Outreach ribbons; or Outreach medallions.

- **High Point Awards:** The highest pointed Gold level rider in each Zone will earn the Golden Backstage Pass to participate in USHJA National Championship Affiliate Sections, the Grand Prix Show Jumping and Hunter Derby course walks, and educational sessions.
- **Trainers Awards:** Trainers who are USHJA free Outreach members or higher will be awarded points based on their students competing in Outreach classes (student must be a USHJA free Outreach members or higher). One trainer from each Zone whose riders have earned 100 or more points cumulatively will be recognized as the USHJA Outreach High Point Trainer.
- **Horses Awards:** Owners of horses competing in Outreach Competitions and Classes wishing to have their horses earn points towards awards must register their horse with USHJA (\$20/year or \$75 lifetime). Horses are not required to be registered with USHJA or micro-chipped to compete in Outreach classes.

OUTREACH PROGRAM REWARDS AND AWARDS

Rewards and awards are based on rider or horse participation across any USHJA Outreach classes. A rider or a horse may accumulate points throughout any or all of the classes, allowing for participation across the many facets of the hunter, jumper and equitation competitions.

REWARDS:

1. Rewards will be given by USHJA Zone.
2. Rewards for competing in any USHJA Outreach Class (Hunter, Equitation, Jumper) will be based on total points earned as follows:
 - a. Bronze Level: riders or horses must earn at least 50-74 points during the competition year.
 - b. Silver Level: riders or horses must earn at least 75-99 points during the competition year.
 - c. Gold Level: riders or horses must earn at least 100 points during the competition year.
3. Riders: Riders achieving a Bronze, Silver, or Gold point level will be eligible to redeem their points at year-end for items of their choice: USHJA logo wear, Bronze, Silver, or Gold Outreach ribbons or Outreach medallions.
4. Horses: Owners of horses achieving a Bronze, Silver, or Gold point level will be eligible to redeem their points at year-end for items of their choice: USHJA logo wear, Bronze, Silver or Gold Outreach stall plates or ribbons.

AWARDS:

Trainers: Outreach Trainers will be recognized by USHJA Zone for year-end awards. At yearend the trainer with the highest cumulative total earned USHJA Outreach Class points associated with Outreach members they train will be recognized as the USHJA Outreach Class High Point Trainer, and with a minimum of 100 points earned during the competition year will be awarded a USHJA Zone Outreach Program High Point Trainer jacket.

Riders: The rider achieving Gold Level status with the highest number of points from each Zone by September 15th will be awarded the "Golden Back Stage Pass", which includes an opportunity to attend the USHJA National Championships. These riders will be invited to participate in the Grand Prix Show Jumping and Hunter Derby course walks, participate in educational sessions, and be given the opportunity to compete at the USHJA National Championships in the Affiliate Championship sections.

Horses: Registered horses will have their Outreach points tracked and ranked within the USHJA Zone. Results will be displayed on the USHJA website.

USHJA OUTREACH CLASS SPECS

Course requirements for all classes:

1. All courses must have at least seven jumps (Exception: Ground Pole Classes)
2. Courses should be appropriate for the level of competition.
3. Oxers and combinations are discouraged for any class below 2'6" or .75m
4. Each height may be offered as Open; Junior; Amateur; Pony; split or combined at management's discretion.

USHJA Outreach Hunter Derby:

Must be entered by the close of the show the day prior. Formal attire recommended but not required. Must ride for ribbons! Class fee is \$35 per horse/rider combination. Six horses/ponies must have completed the course in order for points to count. To be eligible, the horse/pony must have entered, shown, and completed at least one class during the weekend. Horse/pony and rider must be a member of the WHJA for year-end Derby points to be awarded. Course to contain a minimum of 8 fences and run in the "Hunt and Go" Derby style format.

USHJA OUTREACH POINTS

Points will be accumulated according to Zone, within the Competition Year dating December 1st to November 30th of the following year.

Rider, horse and trainer requirements:

1. Horses competing in the USHJA Outreach Program will accrue points only if they are registered with USHJA.
2. Participation as a rider or as the owner of a horse will be tracked based on place of residence within a USHJA Zone.
3. A rider's home USHJA Zone will be determined by their place of residence during the current competition year (December 1 – November 30). If a rider changes Zones, because of school, work, or other, rider must request permission change his home Zone in writing to the USHJA for competition points to follow the rider from one Zone to the next.
4. A Junior Rider has not reached his/her 18th birthday as of December 1st of the previous year.
5. An Adult Amateur is no longer eligible as a Junior Rider and is an Amateur according to USEF Rules (GR128).

USHJA OUTREACH POINTS

Rider:

1. Riders must be an Outreach member (or higher) on or before the first day of competition to accrue rider points. Membership is free.

2. At least three entries must complete the class for points to count.

3. Points awarded:

1st place – 10 points

2nd place – 6 points

3rd place – 4 points

4th place – 2 points

5th place – 1 point

6th place – ½ point

Horse:

1. Horses must be registered with USHJA for points to be tracked. Otherwise, horses are not required to be registered with USHJA or be microchipped to compete in USHJA Outreach classes. Horse Registration is \$20 for an Annual Recording, or \$75 for a Lifetime Recording.

2. At least three entries must complete the class for points to count.

3. Points awarded:

1st place – 10 points

2nd place – 6 points

3rd place – 4 points

4th place – 2 points

5th place – 1 point

6th place – ½ point

Trainer:

Trainers of riders participating in the USHJA Outreach Program wishing to be recognized for yearend awards and recognition must be a USHJA Outreach member or higher on or before the first day of competition. Outreach Membership is free.

GROUND RAIL HUNTER & EQUITATION

Ground Rail classes are a great opportunity for riders to experience the show ring in a low-key, low-pressure, fun class. Ground Rail classes are for entry level riders in their first year of showing. Formal attire is not required. Riders may not cross enter into any other classes except Beginner Equitation Walk-Trot or Short Stirrup Equitation Walk-Trot. Riders will be required to walk and trot for under-saddle classes. The "Over Poles" classes will be conducted as 'once around the outside' courses and can be ridden at the trot or canter. Ribbons are awarded through 8th place. This division does not award Champion or Reserve Champion and will not accumulate points or an award at the Year End Awards or any Local, Zone or National awards.

Horses entered in a Ground Rail class PLUS any other class at the show ARE required to pay the fees associated with those other classes and any other fees incurred.

Hunter classes are judged on performance, manners of mount, and suitability at this level of competition. Equitation classes are judged on control of mount, appropriate pace, steering and effective position of rider.

Ribbons are awarded through 8th place.

HUNTER DIVISIONS

USHJA OUTREACH BEGINNER RIDER HUNTER

Open to riders in their first year of showing or riders who have never won a blue ribbon at a USEF-recognized horse show. Riders will retain their eligibility for the entire show season. Riders who have won three (3) blue ribbons over fences (between Hunter and Equitation) at USEF-recognized shows are ineligible to compete in a Beginner Rider division the following year. Riders may only show at 1'9", and once riders enter classes with higher jump specifications, riders are immediately ineligible for this division. Classes are \$15 each.

* May only cross enter into the Beginner Rider Equitation. Riders competing in this division cannot compete in the under saddle classes for Hunter divisions with fence heights 2'3" or over. They may do their age group Equitation flat classes only. No bending lines and no in-and-outs.

* Beginner riders who are 11 and under and do not compete over fences in their Beginner division may compete in the Short Stirrup under saddle and age group Equitation flat class. Once a Beginner rider competes over fences in their division, they are no longer eligible to rider in any division flat classes where the fence height exceeds their Beginner Rider division (1'9").

USHJA OUTREACH SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER

The division is open to horses or ponies ridden by a junior, 11 years of age and under, who is a beginner rider. Riders in this division may not cross enter into any other WHJA year end award class at the same show except the Short Stirrup Equitation and 11 and under Equitation. Riders competing in this division cannot compete in the under saddle classes for Hunter divisions with fence heights 2'3" or over. No bending lines and no in-and-outs.

USHJA OUTREACH LONG STIRRUP HUNTER

The division is open to horses or ponies ridden by a rider 12 years of age or older, who is a beginner rider. Riders in this division may not cross enter into any other WHJA year end award class at the same show except the Long Stirrup Equitation. Riders competing in this division cannot compete in the under saddle classes for Hunter divisions with fence heights 2'3" or over. They may do their age group Equitation flat classes only.

In the spirit of Halloween we will be awarding a prize for best costume!

12 or more obstacles are set up in the arena from 2'9"-3'6". Each obstacle carries from 10 to 120 points according to its difficulty. Combination obstacles are not allowed. The obstacles must be built so that they can be jumped in both directions.

The points allocated to the obstacles may be repeated at the discretion of the Course Designer. The competitor is credited with the number of points carried by each obstacle that he has jumped correctly. No points are awarded for an obstacle knocked down. Each competitor has 45 (minimum) to 90 seconds (maximum). During this time, he may jump all the obstacles he wishes in any order and in any direction. He may cross the starting line in either direction.

The starting line must be provided with four flags; a red and a white flag at each end of the line. Ringing the bell declares the end of the round. The competitor must then cross the finishing line in one direction or the other to allow his time to be recorded. If he does not cross the finishing line, he is placed last of the competitors with the same number of points. The finishing line must be provided with four flags; a red and a white flag at each end of the line. If the fixed time is reached at the moment when the horse is already taking off (front hooves off the ground), this obstacle counts if it is correctly jumped.

Any obstacle knocked down during a round will not be rebuilt; if it is jumped again, no points will be credited to the competitor. The same applies for knocking down an obstacle in disobedience or for displacing a lower part positioned in the same vertical plane. In the case of a disobedience without a knock-down, the competitor may jump that obstacle or continue to the next obstacle.

Each obstacle may be jumped twice. The act, voluntarily or not, of jumping an obstacle for the third time or of passing between the flags of an obstacle for the third time or of passing between the flags of an obstacle already knocked down does not incur elimination. However, the competitor does not score the points allotted to this obstacle. All disobediences are penalized by the time lost by the competitor. The competitor must stop after a fall. Nevertheless he is placed according to the points obtained up to the moment of his fall disregarding the time.

There will be a "Joker Fence" up to 4' in height. The joker is required to be jumped within twenty seconds after the fixed time has expired and after the competitor has crossed the finishing line, only one attempt is allowed. If it is jumped correctly, the Joker is worth 200 points, BUT if it is knocked down, 200 points must be deducted from the total points obtained so far by the competitor.

The competitor who has obtained the highest number of points will be declared the winner. In the event of equality of points, the fastest time taken between the starting line and the finishing line will decide. In the event of equality of points and time for first place, there will be a jumpoff according to the same formula with a fixed time of 40 seconds.
